Alpine Combined Training, Dressage & Showjumping Weekend

MADEC members Julie King riding Runaway Bandit, Lauren Lines riding Sir George The Almighty, Anette Allan riding Gorserella Matilla and Jane Parks riding Parkview Irish Lily competed at the Alpine Combined Training, Dressage and Showjumping day's held over the weekend withtwo days of competition in the beautiful town of Bright on sand arenas specifically designed for competition purposes.

Saturday was very fresh and overcast for the Dressage and Combined Training sections on offer. Julie and Bandit in Level 4 Dressage placed 9th in the 4C and 9th in the 4F and after their clear Showjumping round for the CT they placed 11th. Anette and Tilly placed well in the Level 4 Dressage 4C and in the 4F and a great clear round in the Showjumping for a 5th in the CT.

Level 3 saw Lauren and George compete in the Dressage 3C for a 2nd place and in the 3F for a 8th place.

Jane and Lily competed in Level 1 Dressage for a 5th in the 1C and an 8th in the 1F. Jane and Lily competed in the Level 2 CT and placed 4th.

Sunday's weather was clear and warmer a great day for Showjumping, rain overnight made the footing a little deep, but overall a great day. Straight Showjumping offered an **AM7** (you jump a course and if you are clear for the first 8-10 fences you get to jump off over another 6-7 fences on time) and **Two Rounds** (you are permitted to jump two rounds as long as you are not eliminated, the second round is on time and penalties apply if you pull rails or have a disobedience).

Julie and Bandit in Level 3 had a great day with a midfield placing in the AM7 and a great 4th in the Two Rounds. Anette and Tilly competed in Level 4 with a midfield placing in the AM7 and a midfield placing in the Two Rounds. Jane and Lily competed in the Level 2 in the AM7 with a 3rd and the Two Rounds with a 4th.

Accumulation of points over the weekend's events in the CT and Showjumping phases saw Julie and Bandit with a 9th Overall in Level 4 and Jane and Lily Reserve Champion Overall in Level 2.











After sold out clinics in Ireland and recently having returned from being invited to New Zealand to teach... NOW it is North East Victorias turn!!

Carlos is recognised around the world for his gentle calm way with horses, helping horses without the use of force or fear. He was recently awarded Quest Equine Welfare 2012 Equitarian Award. This award was established to recognise those in the industry who offer consistent, compassionate and selfless service to benefit the horse and improve the welfare of all horses.

The basis of Carlos's philosophies is to use gentle and clear communication to establish trust, consistency, co-operation and understanding - Through the Eyes of the Horse TM. Carlos' clinics cover topics such as horse psychology, body language, trust and unity,; partnership, developing feel, balance and self-carriage, bitless riding and more. Clinic participants are also invited to put forward their own areas of interest or concern, such as bucking, rearing, handling feet, canter leads or confidence issues (no matter what discipline you are involved in) that could be address in the clinic context.

Day 1 - The morning session will cover groundwork (respect, responsiveness, softness, desensitising and leadership, translating into ridden and problem solving). The afternoon session will cover ridden with a focus on straightness, smooth transitions, softness, calmness, correct back-up, lateral movements and any issues riders wish to address from basic to advanced issues/training.

Day 2 - Will start with a basic refresher for both horse and rider of the lessons covered the previous day and will be largely ridden work (after all we are here to ride aren't we!) - a continuation of the previous days ridden work with further development or addressing any issues riders may wish to raise from basic to advanced problems/training to help you progress with your horse both on the ground or under saddle.
